It's more than just a smelly nuisance; it's a sign of your pet's overall oral health.


Domino Effect

Warning Signs

- Bad breath

- Loose teeth
- Facial swelling

An initial check-up to Dr. Melodie Limpach can determine the extent of your pet's tooth decay, blood will be drawn to make sure your pet will not have adverse affects to anesthesia, and an appointment for the cleaning will be made for the following Tuesday.
